

Dear Sir or Madam,

We turn to you as a representative in the European Parliament, because we are deeply concerned about the fate of our Motherland - Poland. As teachers, as well as parents, we strive to bring up children and young people on the basis of our national values, acquaint them with the history of our country, teach them patriotism and the love of the Fatherland. We ask you very much to bend to the fate of the Republic of Poland and express your opposition to the planned changes to the European Treaty and the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union

We are concerned about the fact that The European Parliament's Committee on Constitutional Affairs has voted to approve an amendment to the European Treaties, which means **opening up a process that will lead to the creation of a European federation with a government in Brussels.** This means the marginalization of the role of national governments and parliaments, which will have a negative impact on the lives of every European, as **the democratic rights of the residents of EU countries will be replaced by the decisions of a Brussels-based, bureaucratic "executive."** It is proposed to make 267 changes to the current Treaty, which radically alters the Community's assumptions.

It is also worrying that the authors of the report and the European Parliament's draft resolution with the proposed treaty changes are five left-wing MEPs from Germany and Belgium, including Guy Verhofstadt, an ardent supporter of the concept of establishing a United States of Europe, the same one who in 2007 labeled participants in the Independence March as fascists, neo-Nazis and white supremacists. In the preamble to the proposed resolution, the authors refer to the 1941 Ventotene Manifesto, whose author was Altiero Spinelli, **an activist of the Communist Party of Italy, an opponent of the existence of nation-states, and a supporter of the federalization of the European continent,** who believed that a "new, true democracy" could only come about through the "dictatorship of the revolutionary party." The manifesto is an ideological statement of commitment to communism.

We call for the rejection of the proposed amendments, as their adoption will mean that we agree to:

- **eliminating the principle of unanimity in European Council votes and transferring decision-making from the level of member states to that of the informal government of the European Union,**

- granting new competencies exclusive to the EU bureaucracy - for example, **in the field of environmental protection** and biodiversity, which means that in matters of climatic policy the Union's voice will be decisive,

- **a significant expansion of shared competencies into new areas** - foreign policy, security policy, border protection, forestry, public health, civil defense, industry and education, areas that have hitherto been the prerogative of member states, which will result in the adoption of regulations that are binding on all countries, even on issues where there is no unanimity among member states, such as school curricula or abortion regulations,

- introduction of **simplified procedures for the suspension of those countries** that officials believe will violate **EU values** (rule of law, democracy, freedom, human rights, equality). The level of generality to which these values refer gives unlimited room for interpretation, and could lead to the rise of powerful states at the expense of smaller and weaker ones, to push through legislation based on the only legitimate interpretation of school curricula or abortion laws,

- replacing the **European Commission** with an **Executive Body**, which will consist of up to **15**

members, meaning that **some states will not have a representative on it**,

- deciding key issues for the future of the community, such as the election of the Executive Body (the former European Commission) or treaty changes, by a simple majority - the changes will take effect if four-fifths of member states decide to ratify them,
- the implementation of a common security and defense policy through the establishment of a Defense Union with European military units, including a permanent rapid deployment capability, under the Union's operational command,
- **federalization of the European Union, with a single government, a common defense policy and a centralized decision-making body, as well as the nucleus of supranational ministries overriding national bodies**,
- Implementing the Common Security and Defense Policy by establishing a **Defense Union** with European military units, including a permanent rapid deployment capability, under the Union's operational command,
- The elimination of the provision that all operational activities of Europol shall be carried out in conjunction and in agreement with the authorities of the Member State or Member States whose territory is affected, and the use of coercive measures shall be the exclusive competence of the competent national authorities,
- Giving the Union the right to decide on the development directions of the Member States, **drafting the general directions of the economic policies of the Member States and supervising economic developments in each Member State**,
- adding as a condition for the existence of the European internal market the issue of **reducing global warming and protecting biodiversity**,
- the enactment by the Union of legislation on the harmonization of laws relating to direct and indirect taxes, including turnover and excise taxes and other direct and indirect taxes,
- replacing provisions on **equality between men and women** with provisions on **gender equality**, which is an attempt to introduce gender ideology into the treaties that denies the existence of biological sex and reduces it to a subjective identity that can be chosen at will.

Plans to amend the European Treaties are accompanied by other **measures that threaten the civil liberties of Europeans. The European Parliament and member states have announced they have reached an agreement to introduce digital identities**. According to the draft of the new law, member states will offer citizens and businesses digital wallets that will be able to link their national digital identity to documents proving other personal characteristics (e.g., driver's license, diplomas, bank account, health status). But the "digital wallet" will be more than just an electronic passport. It will include EVERYTHING the government wants to know about us. It will store all of our personal data, biometric data, medical records, and soon the digital currency of the European central bank. The EU government that is emerging from the treaty changes being pushed through will have the ability to track our every move. If the EU Parliament passes the introduction of a digital identity wallet, there will be a European digital surveillance state. What a threat digital surveillance systems can be we saw during the Covid pandemic - vaccine passports not only limited individual privacy, we had to deal with discrimination against citizens and limiting their access to services. Let's make sure that yesterday's "sanitary passport" does not become tomorrow's "document of a good, obedient citizen," a solution already being tested in a country of developed "party-population democracy."

We call for cross-party consensus in the name of defending Poland's independence and

sovereignty - thirty years after being freed from the "boon" of the communist economy, our country cannot afford a return to central planning, "universal welfare," social "equality" pushed by the new secretaries of sustainable socialist development.
